

#### STEWARDSHIP: LEGACY GIVING

Financial planning, retirement, estate planning, legacy giving—these are all topics that may not come up too often at church. However, the church has many resources available to help navigate these topics through the lens of our faith. Jesus talks a lot about money and challenges his followers to place more value on their relationship with God and one another than accumulating monetary wealth. Not all of us find ourselves in a position to have an abundance of monetary wealth and some of us struggle to pay bills. We are all in a different place as it comes to finances and that's ok. No matter your net worth, all of us can benefit from faithful conversations around finances. Recently, Luther Seminary shared a new financial planning resource free of charge to Lutheran Congregations. After receiving this resource the Stewardship Team thought it worth sharing with you all. Thank you to Jeff King for pulling together the following information—we hope to offer an adult forum soon to discuss this topic further and answer questions you may have. Peace, Pr. Krista

Did you know Mt Si Lutheran Church has establish an Endowment fund in 2018 in which you can donate cash, stocks, etc.? There are several ways to leave a legacy to a qualified charitable organization, but we are only going to mention a couple of them.

The current fair market value is \$5,149. The initial investment in the Endowment fund is \$4,888.

You can designate in your will to leave a dollar amount or a percentage of your estate to the Endowment fund and reduce the value of your estate and still leave a remainder to your heirs.

Are you approaching required minimum distribution (RMD) age? If so, you can designate any amount from your RMD to the church's endowment fund and avoid paying income taxes

Is your total estate is value over \$2,193,000 in Washington State? Is your total estate value over \$12,920,000 for federal tax purposes?

The values cited above are for 2023 and are subject to change.

If so, you may owe estate taxes to Washington State and/or to the Federal government or both.

A way to lower your estate value is by giving a portion of your estate to a qualified charitable distribution (QCD). i.e. Mt Si Lutheran Church

A QCD is a direct transfer of funds from your IRA, payable directly to a qualified charity, as described in the QCD provision in the Internal Revenue Code. Amounts distributed as a QCD can be counted toward satisfying your RMD for the year, up to \$100,000. The QCD is excluded from your taxable income.

This is not the case with a regular withdrawal from an IRA, even if you use the money to make a charitable contribution later on. If you take a withdrawal, the funds would be counted as taxable income even if you later offset that income with the charitable contribution deduction.

#### **COUNCIL REPORT**

Greetings from your council.

Our income in May was \$21,107 compared to \$12,074 in April. Our expenditures for May were \$20,184 compared to \$15,834. This gave us a net income for May of \$923. We know there were some extenuating circumstances that caused both the income and expenses to increase significantly in May. We are waiting to see what the numbers will be in June, which we expect to be a more normal month for both income and expenses.

Council is looking into the possibility of sharing our facilities with another congregation. If we do this we would expect to receive money from the other congregation for the use of our facility. We will be reaching out to the synod to help us identify a group in our area that may be looking for a place to meet. If we are able to find another congregation we would need to work out a rental agreement that would set a price and establish procedures for coordination on roles, responsibilities and timing for usage of the facilities.

On May 20th the synod provided training opportunities for us. Dave Spurling, Lisa Samson, Jack Boller, and Pastor Krista attended. One of the sessions was conducted by a group called Reconciling in Christ or RIC. This group works solely with the ELCA congregations to go through a yearlong process to decide if we really mean "all" when we say all are welcome or do we mean all who look like us and think like us. At the end of the year a congregation will vote to decide if they want to be recognized as a RIC congregation. Several congregations in our synod have gone through this process and voted to be RIC congregations. At this time the council decided that instead of going through the RIC process we will develop a welcoming statement that explains who we are, what we believe, and that all are welcome. Once council has developed this statement we will present it to the congregation for approval.

We still have a council vacancy that we would like to fill. We meet the second Tuesday of the month at 7:00 pm. If you are interested, let Pastor Krista or a council member know.




# Kids and Farmer's Market Fun!


# The Sunday flower chart is in the Fellowship Hall outside of the library.

# **BISHOP'S LETTER July - August 2023**



As I write this, I am still re-living a beautiful experience that I had last weekend. Five of my friends and I drove to the Gorge Amphitheatre and we saw Joni Mitchell in concert. For some of you, this might be interesting, for others, you might not even know who Joni Mitchell is. For me, the time was filled with joy, laughter, tears, friendship, and community ... not to mention amazing music and storytelling.

But this isn't about Joni Mitchell ... at least not entirely. For what struck me as I sat on the grass with 26,000 other people, was the church-like feeling that was there. Or perhaps I should say the "Jesusy" feeling that was there. Or maybe the Holy Spirit in

action feeling. And this came from the crowd itself.

As we all sat crowded together on blankets and chairs, people told stories, shared food and drink, sang songs, helped those who were having difficulty navigating the hillside, and together we became community. The little children sitting to the right of me danced, the young girls sitting to the left of me accepted blankets from my friend, and the man in front of me told me that he had traveled from North Carolina to see Joni. He told me that he was surprised to discover the Gorge was not located in Seattle!

There was one point in the concert, after it had gotten dark, when Joni was singing and people – one by one – started shining the flashlight from their cellphones towards the stage. Throughout the crowd, little points of light lit up the darkness. Now, if you have been to a concert in the last ten years, this is a common occurrence. Cell phone lights have taken the place of lighters being raised. However, because Joni has not performed in over twenty years, she was bemused by the lights. She turned to the person next to her on stage and said, "It looks like a fallen constellation. Where did they get all those lights?"

I thought her words and her surprise were charming. But as I looked around me, at the people sharing blankets, at those with arms around each other swaying to the music, at the cozy darkness around us and the lights looking like fallen stars, it was more than charming. It was holy.

For a moment, we were a cathedral. For a moment, we were community. For a moment, we were one.

At our best, this is what it means to be church. To be the Body of Christ. To practice hospitality and generosity, and grace. To see Christ in one another. To accept others' limitations and to be accepting of our own.

I confess that all was not perfect at the Gorge. There was a person close to me who insisted on singing every word to every song. While her voice was fine, I was not there to hear her but to hear Joni. There were people who cut in line after we had been waiting two hours to get inside. There was a driver who bullied his way into the front of the very long line of vehicles as we were leaving.

Perhaps this is like church, too. At least church as a human construction. Those of us who have been part of a church for a while, we know that church is not always sharing blankets and food, singing and joy. Sometimes, as humans, we hoard our stuff. We take offense at others. We refuse to listen. We bully. We push. Our voices sometimes drown out other voices.

And yet ... I pray that the moments of grace we receive this summer – from music at the Gorge to singing lustily in church, from sharing food on a hillside to receiving the body and blood of Christ – may we be church together. May we know and make it known that all are fully loved by God – in the times when we are like fallen constellations and in the times we are not.

May your summer be filled with holy moments.
