From Pastor Mark's Desk.....

Faithful Service

If you're going to try to read this in a hurry, put it down, this might take a few minutes...make the time. I want you to sit down and notice all the things that are happening around you. Pay attention to the million things around you that are normally filtered out. Is your chair hard or soft, are you sitting on the couch? Is the



sunlight streaming through the window? Is it raining? What shape do the clouds make? What's that on the carpet? Are the trees shaking in the wind? What lights are on? Can you hear traffic or birds or a radio? How about the hum of florescent lights? Pay attention to shapes, sounds, textures, and movement. Every day our senses are bombarded with an impossible amount of information and so to simply survive in this onslaught of stimulation we filter a lot of it out. And this is good; imagine driving a car and having to focus on maintaining the position and speed of the vehicle while also being aware of every little detail around you. Generally, as human beings, we are good at filtering out information that is inconsequential to the task at hand. We are able to focus on a specific set of details while letting the rest fade into the background.

I wonder sometimes if our filters get too good? Are we so good at singlemindedly focusing on the immediate task at hand that we filter out too much? I think a lot of what the Spiritual Practices do is help us peel back the layers of filters we put between us and the world and let God back in. In the simple practice of awareness we open ourselves to seeing God at work in the world when otherwise we would filter that divine presence out. As we approach the season of Lent we take this as an opportunity to be intentional about being aware of God in us and in the world around us.

Our theme this year is Faithful Service. Faithful service is more than going out into the world to do things that seem necessary or feel good. Faithful service is a reflection of the light of God that has shined in our hearts. But for our service to be faithful requires that we be in touch with the one to whom we claim to be faithful. We need to let that light shine into our hearts if we hope to reflect it. This is why being aware of what we're filtering out is so important—we take the time to examine our lives, the world around us, and to be aware. God is present in the world. Period. The trick is for us to practice seeing God in the world. That awareness is the beginning of our faithful service. From that awareness of God we delve into the world and are able to faithfully love and serve our neighbors and all of creation. Faithful service is a rhythm of life we adopt:

being aware of God

to being sent into the world

to being more aware of God in the world, and on and on.

Take this time of Lent to be intentional and aware. Invest in your church community and the people of faith who love you. And let's together delve into Faithful Service. Please read more on pg. 2.

Give up gloom—enjoy the beauty that is all around you.


Give up jealousy—pray for trust.





Fireworks & Forgiveness

"*Return to the Lord your God for God is gracious and merciful, slow to anger and abounding in steadfast love.*" *Joel 2:13*

I was in the third grade. The Fourth of July had passed when my neighbor Johnny Buck and I found some duds - fire crackers that were lit but had not exploded. Johnny Buck and I knew from watching the big boys on the block that you could explode them by ripping them in two, pouring out a little of the powder and lighting them with a match. Our attempt to light them on the front porch of our house was interrupted by our inability to keep the match lit.

Being the rocket scientists that we were we decided to take them inside the house. My mother's dresser seemed like the perfect hard surface to complete the task. Sure enough we kept the match lit and had ourselves a swell explosion. What we hadn't taken into account was the black scar it would leave on the dresser top. Fortunately mom and dad were not home so I covered the spot with a magazine hoping against hope that it would never be discovered.

The problem was my conscience began to eat me alive. I was absolutely miserable by the time my parents arrived home. They barely made it into the house when I blurted out my confession and broke into tears.

My father who meted out the punishment at the end of a belt went with me to examine the crime scene. Once the magazine was removed, the extent of the irreparable damage was obvious. I knew what I had coming. Honestly a spanking was better than trying to live with the guilt. What happened next took me totally by surprise. Just when I expected my father to unbuckle his belt he turned to me and said, "Kirby, your mother and I are very pleased you told us the truth. Telling the truth is the most important lesson you can learn." That was it. No lecture, no punishment, and no spanking. It's fair to say those fire crackers were not duds. They left a lifelong impression upon me. For me Lent is a season of invitation in which we are invited to explore more honestly the truth about who we are. It is a time to come to grips with what it means to be human. It is an opportunity to look at the shadow side of our lives.

Lent is made possible precisely because of the invitation. "Return to The Lord your God because God is gracious and merciful, slow to anger and abounding in steadfast love." Yes, we have a God who truly wants the best for all of God's children.

May your Lenten journey be bold and full of truth and grace.
