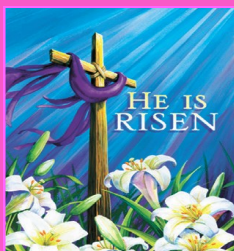

From Pastor Krista's Desk.....

THE TOMB IS EMPTY!



Dearest Brothers and Sisters in Christ, grace and peace to you from God our Father and our Lord Jesus the Christ! In case you missed the headlines....THE TOMB IS EMPTY! Jesus, who was taken down from the cross, wrapped in clean linens and placed in the tomb with the stone door secured so tightly the light could not enter is gone, missing, is no longer in the place he was left! Can we believe the headlines? Can we trust the news? Can it be that

someone stole Jesus' body? What other explanation could there possibly be? The women who went are saying that Jesus is alive, but that is nonsense, right? Jesus raised Lazarus from the dead...but a dead person can't raise themselves from the dead or can they? Who do we trust? How do we decide? What evidence is there that Jesus lives?

In this Easter Season, as we proclaim through song, word and worship that Jesus lives, I invite you to consider the question....What evidence is there that Jesus lives? What have you seen in your own life of Jesus alive and present? What have you seen in the world to show you that Jesus is still teaching, still healing, still calling us to follow? The evidence is all around us. I see it every day when I'm paying attention and I trust you do too. I trust that Jesus lives when I see a community of faith pray together and support one another. I trust that Jesus lives every time I take the bread of life and cup of salvation in my hands. I trust that Jesus lives every time I mess up and cry out to God for forgiveness. I see Jesus alive and at work in each of you as he works to shape his disciples into new creations of pure love, joy and grace. This is a season to give thanks for the living Jesus who gave us freedom from our sin and reconciliation with our God so that we can live in the reality of God's deep love for us. We serve a God of the living, not of the dead. Jesus reminds us that God will never leave anything in a state of death. On the contrary it is God's nature to bring back to life and to heal all that is broken and discarded. God can't help but resurrect . Jesus lives, the tomb is empty, what once was dead lives eternally. This is why our God is worthy of our praise. This is why Jesus is worthy of our worship. This is why the Spirit is worthy of our devotion. Let us give thanks to the living God! Christ is Risen! He is Risen Indeed, Alleluia! Amen! **HAPPY EASTER!!!**

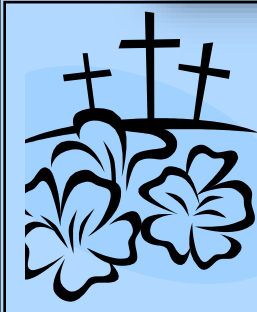
Our theme Bible verse is from Colossians:

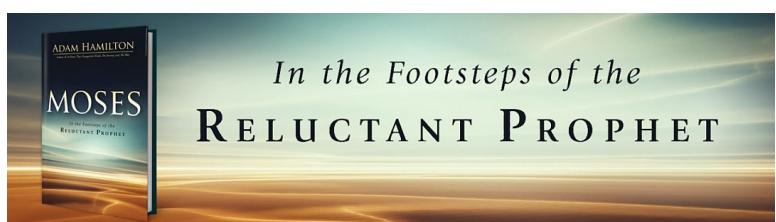


Easter Breakfast Buffet—Apr. 1st 9:15-10:30AM!

*Free will offering greatly appreciated and will go towards a summer carnival outreach to the community organized by Mt. Si Confirmation Youth

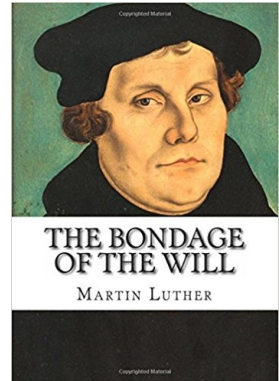
**Last Easter we raised \$850 for Family & Youth Ministry and we plan to use that money for a youth gathering this year. Thank you for all the generous donations.

Greetings and peace to you all from your Church council.

Spring is here, a time of rebirth and renewal. In the next few weeks our congregation will be experiencing this on several fronts. We will be hiring a new Children, Family, & Youth Director (CYF), we will begin a capital campaign to raise money for the roofs and other needs, we will plant our garden for this year, and we will begin a Wednesday night youth and adult study group.

As I mentioned in my last council report, the council held our annual retreat on January 20. During the retreat we did some brain-storming on ideas for improving our ministry to members of our church family, to our community and to the greater world. We will be holding another retreat on April 21 to further develop ideas identified in the first retreat and make plans to present them to the congregation.

The selection panel for the Children, Family, & Youth Director position have received two viable applications. They are in the process of interviewing and hope to make a final decision soon. Their goal is to have someone onboard by the end of May.

The stewardship committee is putting the final touches on a capital fundraising effort. Mt. Si plans to introduce this to the congregation via a letter sent early April. We will have one worship at 9:30AM on Apr. 22nd followed by a meal hosted by Stewardship & Finance to kick-off the Capital Campaign. Please plan to attend worship & a meal.

The council is developing a survey to gather input from the congregation regarding the worship life of this community. This should be rolled out to the congregation soon. We will then use this assessment to discern future worship styles and practices.

If you have any ideas or issues you would like to raise to the council, please contact any of the council members or Pastor Krista and we will work with you to get them to the council.

As we move ahead be watching for opportunities to volunteer to serve in our ministries and help fulfill our mission to serve our members, our community, and the larger world.

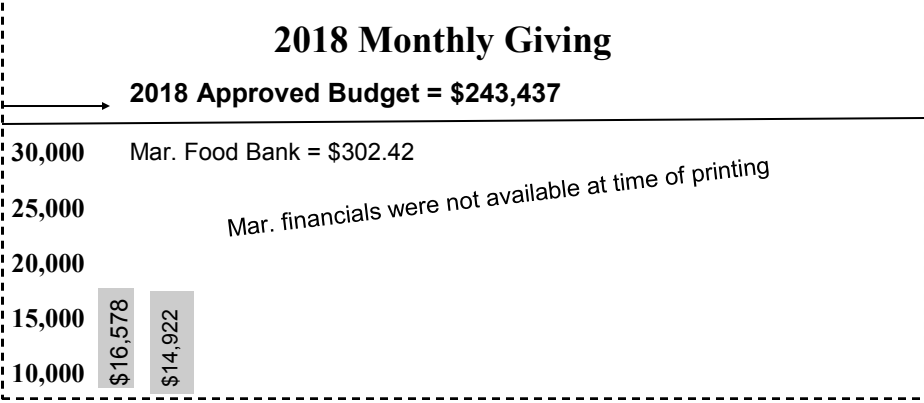

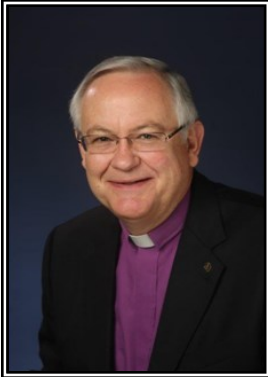

And Who Is My Neighbor?

The story of the Good Samaritan is tied up with the question from a man of the law, "And who is my neighbor?" It seems an easy question to answer on first hearing it. After all, you know who your neighbors are. Right? I mean, you may not know them by name, but you know who they are. Right?

Growing up my neighbors were the Strucks next door, the Russells on the other side, and the Mendenhall's across the street. I could add the names to a few houses in each direction. They were our neighbors. It meant we greeted one another, we borrowed eggs and sugar, and, when there was a block party, you could count on them being there. When I became a teenager, they were the people who ratted me out for speeding in the neighborhood.

The Good Samaritan story quickly points out that "neighbor" has a profound meaning in the scriptures as it stretches most everyone's understanding of neighbor. Neighbor is any - and every - child of God.

You may have heard that in lieu of our traditional Synod Assembly Business Meeting, we are having two gatherings this spring: June 2 at Saint Andrews (Bellevue) and June 9 at Bethlehem (Marysville). Everyone is invited to be a part of these gatherings as we come together under the theme of WHO IS MY NEIGHBOR? These gatherings are not limited to "Voting Members" only. In fact, you are encouraged to bring a whole crowd from your congregation.












Throughout the day we will be exploring how to be neighbors in a world in which "neighbor" is approaching being placed on the endangered species list. There will be three forum times with over sixteen options from which to choose. They are designed to help us more fully understand how we can be "neighbor." The topics range from global music to earth ministry; from congregational hospitality to community partnerships; from listening to leadership; from human trafficking to being ally and advocate for our neighbors of different color, orientation, economic status, faith, or nationality.

Serving as your Bishop I have discovered that there is a growing hunger in our territory to be together – to gather as neighbors. I sincerely hope I will see you at one of the gatherings.

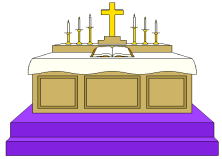
