# Pastor's Note

Grace and peace to you from God our Father and our Lord and Savior Jesus the Christ!

Merry Christmas and blessed Epiphany to you! Since we don't have many stories of Jesus' childhood we move quickly from Jesus' birth to his ministry some 30 years later. However, the stories in Luke of Jesus as a young boy are worth taking a moment to look at before we hurry on to Jesus' teachings, healings and miracles. Luke recounts two important stories of Jesus as a child. The first is when Jesus is just 8 days old. Mary and Joseph go to the Temple in Jerusalem to follow in the teachings of Abraham and Moses to have Jesus circumcised and officially named in the presence of God. As Mary and Joseph enter the Temple grounds we are introduced to two elders, Simeon and Anna. Both are devout Jews who have been waiting for the coming of the Messiah, the anointed, who would restore God's people. Upon seeing Jesus the Holy Spirit helps them to recognize that this baby is indeed that promised Messiah. Simeon and Anna will both tell Mary and Joseph how precious and important this baby is and both recognize that they can now depart in peace with the knowledge that God has fulfilled the promises made to his people. This story reminds us one very important truth (along with many others), belief that Jesus is the Messiah comes as a gift from the Holy Spirit not from logical evidence or

traditional forms of proof. Trusting that Jesus is the Messiah is an act of pure faith and that faith is not something we figure out on our own. Faith is that gift graciously and generously given and it is the work of the Holy Spirit to give that gift freely through the sharing of the Gospel message with others. Who shares the Gospel message? All God's faithful people, strangers, neighbors, friends, relatives, coworkers, rich, poor, male, female, old, young....you get the idea....What is the Gospel message? Luther puts it very simply; We are saved by grace through faith apart from works of the law and it is Jesus who accomplishes this for us. When this message is shared the Spirit goes to work to gift faith to the one who hears it. It is instantaneous? Rarely. Why not? Faith is not coercion or brainwashing...faith is born out of relationship. The Gospel is a seed that, once planted, needs to be tended and nurtured and, not necessarily by the person who first shared the Gospel story. Simeon and Anna studied Scripture, prayed and devoted themselves to God. They believed the promise of a Messiah would come to fruition. And so, when the Spirit opened their eyes to have faith that this baby was the Messiah, they trusted that word to be true even though they had no good reason to. I would like to invite you to reflect on your faith. How has faith found its way into your life? Who has helped spark that gift in you by sharing the Gospel? As you reflect I invite you to give thanks to God for the gift of faith and the gift of Jesus, the Messiah. Peace, Pastor Krista

Spirit Article January 2020

I was sitting in Resident Assistants training at Pacific Lutheran University in 1986. Suddenly the door opened and three people walked in: two men and one woman. They were introduced as the new campus pastors at PLU. I couldn't stop staring at the woman. In my twenty years or earth at that time, I had never met a pastor who was a woman. Pastor Susan Briehl changed my understanding of ministry, what it means to be a pastor, and what a difference it makes when you hear preaching from someone who has wrestled with much of what you have wrestled with, too.

The year 2020 marks the 50th anniversary of the ordination of women into Word and Sacrament ministry. While women have been preaching for thousands of years before this (think Sarah and Miriam and Mary Magdalene to name a few) the predecessor bodies of the ELCA felt called by God to open up the pulpit, the font, and the table to women for the first time after studying scripture and the Lutheran Confessions.

This decision wasn't made lightly. Seminaries, judicatories, and other groups took time to arrive at the decision to ordain women. In the end, though, these various groups realized that there was nothing in scripture, the Lutheran Confessions, or church constitutions to prevent the ordination of women. As

Luther Seminary's Board of Directors wrote in 1966, "God has left the details of the ministerial office to the discretion of the church, to be developed according to its needs and according to the leading of the Holy Spirit."

And just like that, the way was open to the thousands of women who have been ordained into Word and Sacrament Ministry in the last fifty years.

While this is an important milestone, we are also mindful that the last fifty years have not been without difficulties. It took ten more years for the first woman of color to be ordained in the Lutheran Church here in the United States. It has only been in the past ten years that LGBTOIA+ people have been able to serve freely. As we celebrate, we also lament the sexism, racism and homophobia that has been part of our church structure. And we are called to work towards a day when all are celebrated and welcome.

In this synod, we are excited to mark this anniversary with some special events. Each woman pastor will be videotaped with their story. At synod assembly in 2020 we will show some of these video interviews. We will also have a festive worship service during synod assembly to celebrate, remember, and look to the future. During this year we invite congregations to commemorate this anniversary. Pastor Nancy Winder, the first woman ordained locally and the 14th woman ordained overall, is happy to come and preach and teach in your local congregation. In addition, there are resources at www.elca.org to use for congregations or clusters.

A brief story: At one of the churches I served there was a man named Dell. On my first Sunday there he came up to me and said, "You know, I didn't vote for you. I don't think women should be pastors." I said, "OK." And left it at that. In spite of telling me that, week after week Dell and his wife were in worship. Week after week they heard me preach. Week after week they received Christ's body and blood as I presided at the Lord's Table.

About three years after I was there, Dell was diagnosed with terminal cancer. I visited him frequently at his home. On one such visit, as I was setting up the Communion elements, Dell said, "You know, I didn't vote for you." I said, "I know." He sat there for a long time in silence. Then he said, "I was wrong." And I looked at him. And I smiled. And I held his hand. And then I reached for the bread and I said, "On the night in which he was betrayed, our Lord Jesus took bread ...."

We give thanks for all the women pastors who proclaim the good news of Jesus, who baptize in the name of the Triune God, and who serve at the Lord's Table. We pray that we continue to be made new into the future.

# Children, Youth and Family Updates

On to a new year with renewal and intentionality. We are working on developing techniques for encouraging and developing character within our children and youth. A great resource for us to use is the Search Institute's 40 Developmental Assets. Merton Strommen, a young Lutheran Youth Director in 1955, developed his doctoral dissertation to address the needs of Lutheran youth. As a result, the Lutheran Youth Research was established in 1960 to use scientific research on youth in religious institutions. The organization evolved and broadened the scope of scientific inquiry to become the Search Institute. Today their research and resources are used internationally within secular and religious organizations as a source for youth development. I have found these resources to be helpful in developing strategies. They focus on identifiable characterbuilding opportunities rather than focusing on what might be wrong. The power of transformation comes from a place of addition rather than merely subtraction. Removing negativity from our lives is significant but the transformative power of adding positive influence far outweighs the mere removal. So much of what we do as a congregation fulfills the 40 Assets, placing intentional focus on what we do aids in making it even more significant.

### **Prayer Chain Update:**


