From Pastor Krista's Desk.....

God: "I have a plan for your life" Welcome to the season of new growth and possibility! As we near the end of the Easter season we move



As we near the end of the Easter season we move swiftly into the season of Pentecost...50 days following the resurrection, this is the festival day on which we celebrate the coming of the Holy Spirit into the midst of God's people in a new and powerful way.

It's a day that some of us take the time to dress in red for worship (May 20th if you're wondering) and often we take the time to ponder what it must have been like to have visible flaming tongues of fire descend on people's heads. We Lutherans are not always great about diving too much deeper with Holy Spirit language....probably because the descriptions of the Holy Spirit are a bit chaotic and overwhelming. The

Holy Spirit is described as fire, water, a voice, a dove, a literal spirit, a rush of wind, a counselor, advocate, creator of new life, as oil and so much more. We might not even be sure about what the Holy Spirit does, let alone be able to describe the Holy Spirit.

Luther describes the Holy Spirit as the one who calls to us through the reading of Scripture, transforms us through that reading and hearing of Scripture, enlightens us with gifts (fruits) of the Spirit such as love, joy, peace, patience, kindness, goodness, faithfulness, gentleness and self-control and has the role of keeping each of us on the path of true faith. Luther says that the Holy Spirit does this for the individual believer and the whole church as a community of believers. Luther and others speak of the Holy Spirit as the worker of change within us that leads us to follow Jesus in new and often unexpected and uncomfortable ways. The Holy Spirit pushes us to do what we otherwise would never do on our own. It is our belief that good work only comes though the Holy Spirit because we are unable to choose to do God's work left to our own devices. Why? Because the work God invites us into is really, truly and deeply challenging. The work God calls us to asks us to set our own interests aside and look only to the best interests of our neighbors. The work of God calls us to set aside all fear and trust God with every fiber of our being. I don't know about you, but I can't do that on my own. I need this thing called the Holy Spirit to keep working on me and shaping me and forming me into the child of God that I hope to be for the sake of my neighbor. I don't hope that the Holy Spirit transforms me so that God will love me...God already loves me and you and all just as we are. I pray for the Holy Spirit's guidance and wisdom so that less people go hungry, more people have a place to sleep at night, so refugees find a place of safety as they rebuild their lives, so that all people regardless of who they are find a welcome wherever they go. The Holy Spirit's whole purpose is to bring us closer to serving our neighbor so that all draw nearer to God and God's kingdom. So, in this upcoming Pentecost Season I invite you to seriously consider how the Holy Spirit might be working in you to serve your neighbor and how the Holy Spirit is transforming this community of faith to serve our neighbors in challenging and uncomfortable ways that we would never attempt of our own will or desire. It's not easy, it never will be, but, Jesus' promise holds as true today as it did for the disciples at his ascension into heaven, "I will be with you always, even to the end of the age." Let's hold Jesus to that promise and see what rollercoaster ride the Holy Spirit will take us on next! Trust that in the midst of it all you remain and always will be a beloved child of God, marked with the cross of Christ forever. Amen!

Greetings and peace to you all from your Church council.

As we move into the heart of spring several exciting things are happening.

The interview panel for finding a new family and youth ministry director presented its leading candidate to the council. We approved making an offer to the candidate. If the offer is accepted we hope to have the new director on board by the end of May. Once we have a person on board we will need lots of support from you, the members of the congregation, to begin rebuilding our family and youth programs. It will take some time but if we all work together we can make it happen.

The council also approved initiating a capital fund drive to raise \$85,000 to replace the roofs on the sanctuary and fellowship hall. The drive will run until next spring. The Stewardship committee hosted a lunch following the service on April 22 to kick off the campaign. Letters will be mailed out to the congregation to explain the fund drive and ask you to make a pledge for the capital campaign. Pledge cards will be collected at both services on **May 20**. In addition to your giving we will be holding fund raising events through the next year to help us reach our goal. If you have any ideas for fund raising events please share them with Pastor Krista, a council member, or with the Stewardship committee.

After some discussion about how to approach the question of going to one service or staying with two, we looked at past congregational surveys on the question. We came to the conclusion that there are two needs that we have to meet. One need is to provide a service that is meaningful and provides each of you with the spiritual experience you want. The other need is to provide the opportunity to connect with all the other members of the congregation to build a more cohesive and supportive church family. The council believes that the first need is best met by providing two different service formats. The second need can be met by holding more family oriented activities outside of the worship service. We have decided that we will stay with two services for the Fall/Winter/Spring with intentional one service Sundays regularly throughout the year for special occasions and community building. We will keep one service in the Summer at 9:30am. Also, one of the goals we have established for the new family and youth director is to work with members of the congregation to organize more family oriented activities for all ages to help foster relationship building among members of our church family.

In May the council will begin looking at our budgeting process. We hope to meet with each of the ministries to look at actual expenses for the last few years. We want to use that information to identify what each ministry expects to spend money on next year and build a budget based on actual need.

Finally, Council affirmed an invitation to serve hot meals at North Bend Community Church six times a year on the 4^{th} Wednesday of the month. We will begin serving these hot meals in June. Look for more information in the newsletter (pg. 7) on how you can help support this new ministry. Jane Benson and Erica Haycox will be coordinating this service opportunity. Also, please support the Rummage Sale June 15th & 16th (details on pg. 3)

If you have any ideas or issues you would like to raise to the council, please contact any of the council members or Pastor Krista and we will work with you to get them to the council.

As we move ahead be watching for opportunities to volunteer to serve in our ministries and help fulfill our mission to serve our members, our community, and the larger world.

from global music to earth ministry;


from congregational hospitality to community partnerships;



Signs of the times

It was not that long ago that the third highest attendance numbers for a Sunday were on Mother's Day. It was a big deal to honor mom's wishes to have all her kids in church. I often met adult children that I didn't know existed. It may have been awkward for them to go to church, but it was one day when you didn't want to disappoint mom. Coffee Hour was always slim because families were off to a Mother's Day brunch following worship. It was the one day when Mom was not expected to do any work. It was a favorite day for restaurant owners as the cash registers were singing.

Father's Day, on the hand, was one of the least attended Sundays. It often fell on the first day of the fishing season. The treat was for dad to take the kids fishing and then return home to big meal.

Fast forward a decade or two - and everything has changed. Not even Hallmark has been able to sustain the power of these special days. I dare say that Mother's Day has fallen off the Church calendar.

These are the kinds of changes in the culture which we don't get to vote on. Multiple factors converge to create new perspectives on what is important and what the culture values. We are but one voice in the conversation.

I know several people for whom Mother's Day elicits tremendous pain. People who had difficult relationships with their mother, those who have lost their mom, people facing fertility challenges, those who have lost children, and women for whom the expectation of motherhood by the culture is not their personal choice. My comments are not intended to be a critique of Mother's Day but rather a reminder for us all how the church must learn to adapt to an always changing culture.

While having this conversation with a congregation's adult forum group, I met a mother who expressed the heart burn she feels trying to navigate her role as mom in the world. She confessed that she has had to forgo her time on Facebook because it made her feel that her parenting skills were lacking given all the postings about how great other people's families are. She spoke about how much she would value a mothers' group of mothers willing to share in the real challenges they face.

I could see the light come on as she began to imagine how this could happen in her congregation and how valuable it would be. She was clear that it would need to be an outreach for new mothers by new mothers. She received affirmation from others for raising the idea, and I encouraged her to consider giving it a try. Such a gathering isn't going to turn around attendance on Mother's Day but it could very well be the "Day" that each one of the participating mothers looked forward to.

There are so many ways in which the church can discover new ways of being church with mothers and fathers, with ALL PEOPLE, that serves to strengthen the fabric of the whole community. We need to listen, learn, and try.
