

Celebrating the 500th Anniversary of the Reformation

On Reformation Sunday, 1967, I attended a Los Angeles area Sunday afternoon celebration of the 450th Anniversary of the

Reformation. The pews were packed and the worship was spirited and joyous. There was a multi-congregational choir featuring the jazz vocalist Nancy Wilson and the preacher was the Rev. Nelson Trout. It was a wonderful celebration of the life and legacy of Martin Luther and his passion for the good news of Jesus Christ. St. Paul sums up the heart of Luther's Reformation message: "For by grace you have been saved through faith, and this is not your own doing; it is the gift

of God—not the result of works, so that no one may boast." (Ephesians 2:8-9)

Mt. Si Lutherans, East King County ELCA congregations, the Northwest Washington Synod of the ELCA and the Evangelical Lutheran Church in America have been hard at work preparing to celebrate this milestone anniversary. Keep reading and you'll learn about a variety of opportunities for worship, learning and celebrating the 500th anniversary of the Reformation in September and October.

Greetings and peace to you all from your Church Council.

As summer winds down and we head into fall, activity is picking up. We are developing our budget for next year, we are anticipating a decision by the call committee to put forth a pastoral candidate for council's approval, and we are preparing for the start-up of Sunday School and the return to two worship services in September.

The Building and Grounds Committee reported that they were able to get the plumbing and the septic system in the parsonage functioning so the house is livable again in case our new pastor would choose to live there. The total cost was less than \$1,000. There is other work that should be done, but is not necessary to make the house livable.

Worship and Music reported that a high-quality piano has been donated by Steve and Sandy Kangas to the church. It will be placed in the sanctuary and we will be getting rid of two older pianos. We are willing to donate them to someone. If you know of anyone interested in taking them, let Andy Velebir or someone on the Worship and Music Committee know.

Because we are in a state of transition and are not sure when a new pastor will be installed, the council decided not to participate in the World Communion Sunday worship with the other Valley churches this year.

The Homeless Shelter Liaison Committee presented a proposal for Mt. Si Lutheran to take a year off from hosting the homeless shelter and explore other ways to support the mission. This proposal was drafted due to safety concerns for our staff and congregation; and management issues. After a lengthy and emotional discussion, the council agreed to present the proposal to the congregation. A congregational meeting was held on August 20th and, after another long and emotional discussion, the congregation approved the proposal by a vote of 45 to 3. We will stay engaged with the homeless shelter management to find ways we can support their mission such as providing more meals to the churches that will be hosting the shelter. We will not be hosting the homeless shelter this winter.

We have a vacancy on the council due to Ann Bartlett moving to Wenatchee. If you are interested in filling this vacancy let Pastor Larry or anyone on the council know and we can install you. We will be needing to fill at least two other vacancies next year. Please prayerfully consider serving and let us know if you are interested. The Church Council meets the second Tuesday of the month. You would need to be available to attend most meetings.

Call Committee Update

Greetings and Grace to you all. Your Call Committee has completed the interview portion of the process. After deep discernment, the Call Committee has recommended a candidate for Call. As the candidate's current congregation is not aware that their pastor has entered the call process, we are not able to reveal their name at present. The candidate feels that their current church is "in a good place" following an extremely difficult merger (a lot to ask of a first-call pastor!) and believes that the newly "merged" church should start with a new pastor to move forward with their new identity. During the month of September, Council will be working with the Personnel Committee to prepare a compensation package that the congregation will vote on in October. The candidate has 30 days to accept the Letter of Call. It's too early to predict a start date at this time, but we are hopeful it would be in time for Advent. Please keep this process in your prayers. Blessings to you all.



Be Willing to Try and Fail....and Try Again

We are living in a time when change takes place so quickly that even the best laid plans can fail. One of my classic experiences of this reality took place when we did a \$1 million expansion at the church I was serving. The expansion included a new nursery - complete with sink and running water, separate play areas for infants and toddlers, as well as a crib and nursing rooms.

We were filled with pride and delight the day we opened the new nursery hoping it would send a clear message to families with young children that they were valued by the faith community. The truth was we were attracting young families and our Sunday school was bursting at the seams.

So, what went wrong? Two new trends were gaining traction. The first was an invention. The all-in-one baby carrier. You know, the bucket-like object that parents carry their babies in? The kind that also serves as a car seat and stroller seat. This allows a parent to remove their child from the car and carry them right into the church. Before long the worship space was filled with small children rocking in their bucket seats while the nursery was barely in use.

The second trend that was unfolding was a growing comfort about nursing in public. Combine the two trends and the need for our state of the art nursery was greatly lessened. Should we have seen it coming? Perhaps, if we were really tuned in.

What we were tuned into was all the information about how important a state of the art nursery was to young families. The problem was by the time we completed our nursery based on the best current information the world around us had changed.

The truth is this is happening all over the world. Talk to Kodak about film, Blockbusters about video, Swiss watch makers, brick and mortar stores, and Ma & Pa Grocery Stores. All once successful enterprises, they have gone the way of the dinosaurs.

The Living Local Movement that our synod is engaged in takes adapting to change seriously. We believe that God is always up to something new. What we are trying to do by dwelling in God's word is to develop the eyes and ears to see how God is working in our day and time. "Behold I am doing something new. Do you not see it?"

Because we are never 100% sure what God is up to we must probe new ideas, new expressions of what it means to be church, new ways to share the gospel. It isn't that gospel that changes. What changes is how we engage it.

Back to the nursery, the lesson we were learning was in order to engage young families we needed to make worship "kid friendly." Welcoming the occasional cry of a baby is to embrace life. Young families often want a more hands-on experience in worship where they are able to worship God through mediums like music, art and dance. Children find joy in being involved in all aspects of the church. Soft toys and coloring pages representing images of the Bible Story can be a big hit.

And that "state of the art" nursery? What did we do with it? It continued to be modified and used by those for whom it was still of value. Today it is being remodeled one more time to respond to the growing needs of a population of children with special needs. It will once again be sacred space set aside to respond with love and support to the cry of God's children.

I want to encourage all our congregations to be more willing to TRY, FAIL and TRY AGAIN.




