Pr. Larry Thomas, An Introduction

Pastor Larry Thomas was born in Los Angeles, California in 1947. He graduated from Reseda High School in 1965. (He's planning to attend his 50th high school reunion in Los Angeles next month!) Pastor Larry graduated from California State University, Northridge in 1970. The following month, Pastor Larry and Ann Hoiland were married in Seattle. In September 1970, they moved to Minneapolis/St. Paul, Minnesota, where Pastor Larry began his studies at Luther Theological Seminary.

Ordained in July 1974, Pastor Larry served Lutheran congregations in Malibu, San Diego, and Chatsworth, California. In 1992, The Thomas Family moved to Issaguah when Pastor Larry was called to serve as lead pastor at Our Savior Lutheran Church. After serving OSLC for 22 years, he retired in November 2014. Ann and Pastor Larry live in downtown Issaguah.

Pastor Larry and Ann are the parents of four children. Their son, Anders, lives in Seattle. Their son Soren, lives in Los Angeles. Their daughter Rebecca and her husband Stephan, live in New York City; their daughter Emily lives with her husband Dontay in San Antonio Texas. Ann currently works as an elder care provider and a spiritual director. Previously she served as the Director of Conference Services at Trinity Lutheran College. Pastor Larry and Ann are oblates at St. Andrew's Abbey, a Benedictine monastery in Valyermo, California. Pastor Larry serves on the board of World Outside My Shoes, a Spokane, Washington, based non-profit that supports the work of Carl Wilkens, the only American to stay in Rwanda during the 1994 genocide.

Since November 10, 2014, Pastor Larry has been enjoying retirement, rest, and renewal. In addition to traveling with Ann to New York, Pennsylvania, Oregon, and California, he has written a discussion guide for "I'm Not Leaving," a documentary about Carl Wilkens and enrolled in two short term classes: A song writing class and a class on the Koran. He also volunteered at Wintergrass, the Bellevue bluegrass festival, and The Seattle International Film Festival. Pastor Larry, who was blessed with three sabbaticals while serving OSLC/Issaquah (1999, 2005, 2012) is grateful to be able to serve Mt. Si Lutheran Church as Pastor Mark's Sunday morning summer sabbatical substitute and

on-call pastor.

YOUR DAILY DEVOTIONS (1)

"Your servant, who is devoted...to...You." (Ps. 119:38 NKJV)

The word "devotion" implies total commitment to someone—giving them your time and attention, enjoying their company, seeking to please them, and making them a priority in your life. And that should be the goal of your daily devotions. But here are two pitfalls to look out for and avoid: 1) "Me-itis." God has promised to bless you. But when you seek His blessing instead of pursuing a relationship with Him, you become me-centered rather than Christ-centered. The truth is, you can pray until you are blue in the face and God won't give you certain things if you're not mature enough to handle them. More than anything in life, Abraham wanted a son. And God gave him one. Yet when God asked him to offer his son as a sacrifice, he didn't hesitate. Abraham proved there was nothing he loved more than God, therefore God promised to bless him and multiply all that he possessed (See Gen. 22:17). Abraham became one of the most successful men in his generation, but his real claim to fame was that God referred to him as a "friend" (Is. 41:8, NKJV). 2) Being too busy. One of the dangers of working for God is that you can fail to worship Him. The Psalmist said, "Ascribe to the Lord the glory due his name" (Ps. 29:2, NIV). The word "due" means "deserving of". When John saw the multitudes in heaven praising God, they were singing, "You are worthy, our Lord and God, to receive glory and honor and power" (Rev. 4:11, NIV). So start your daily devotions in praise by saying: "Lord, I'm here because You deserve to be worshipped and adored."


Mt. Si Says Farewell and God's Blessings to James Mehring



Lori Murton



What Makes for Success?

But they were silent, for on the way they had argued with one another who was the greatest. He sat down, called the twelve, and said to them, "Whoever wants to be first must be last of all and servant of all." - Mark 9:34-35 (NRSV)

It is the season for graduations. It begins so soon in today's world. Kim takes care of a little boy named Cooper who now is a proud graduate of Lord of Life Lutheran Preschool. I asked him what graduation means and he said, "It is when you are done with one school,

you get the summer off and then you go to kindergarten." So there you have it!

Graduation is stirring my memories of graduating from Inglemoor High School in 1970. I have fond memories of all the activities that topped off our Senior Year. I was elected to be the class speaker and spent hours working on my speech. The compelling line, "It is going to take a hell of lot more than tear gas and guns to hold this generation down." We were a generation that believed that we would change the world and there would be war no more. Sad to say, we went on to be the greatest consuming generation in all of history. Like in the movie the Big Chill, we traded in our ideals for a place at the table of corporate America.

I was also elected by my peers as the "Boy Most Likely to Succeed." My counterpart was my classmate and dear friend Sara Forhan. Sara certainly lived into the recognition. She became a medical doctor specializing in gynecology and went on to work for the Centers for Disease Control in Atlanta. She was a near 4.0 student so it came as no surprise.

On the other hand, I was the class clown and found my way into the principal's office on more than one occasion. I remember Mr. Siverson would simply shake his head and say, "Unti, I expect more out of you."

So, did I "succeed"? I have been deeply blessed by serving as a pastor. It is a humble honor to be able to serve the church and people of this community. I have no regrets, and yet I dare say in the eyes of many of my classmates I have not lived up to the title they gave me. I can already hear the question at the 50th Reunion: "What the hell is a bishop?" Every pastor knows how easy it is to stop the conversation when you announce what you do.

So I asked five year old Cooper, "What do you think a bishop is?" Cooper's response, "A bishop is in charge of all the pastors." (Hold onto your ideals, young Cooper!) But a call to bishop, a call to pastor, a call to be a follower of Jesus is not likely to be something that will impress my classmates.

Little does Cooper know, now that he is a big graduate, he gets to spend the rest of his life deciding what makes for success. Is it the high paying job, the nice house and the fast car, or is it something else? "Whoever wants to be first must be last of all and servant of all." Hang in there, Cooper!






