### **Council Report**

Greetings from your 2024 Church Council.

Council met on 8/13, welcoming Pastor Krista back! The Sabbatical "A-Team" (administrative support) has agreed to continue working with Pastor to manage our workload.

Our finances remain positive, with YTD Net Income of \$338 reported in July. This includes our Capital projects (Fellowship Hall re-flooring) and Sabbatical expenses. We appreciate our donors and supply pastors, who have faithfully given of their offerings and time.

2025 plans and budget requests are being worked. A Fall Council Retreat is planned for October.

Building & Grounds is compiling a list of items needing maintenance or service in the near future.

Council and the Executive team are working with the East King County Synod Cluster, who is developing a formal charter for resource sharing, ministry coordination, and consolidation of certain costs within the participating churches. The Bellevue churches (St Andrews, Cross of Christ, and St Luke's) will be early adopters, with possible later addition of Mount Si, Our Savior and Sammamish Hills Lutheran. We are creating a Frequently Asked Questions (FAQ) sheet to explain how this would affect Mount Si.

Setup of the defibrillator was reviewed. The unit is installed in the church basement across from the elevator, to offer quick access from the sanctuary and Fellowship Hall. Chris Sampson, an experienced CPR trainer has provided training to the first group. Labelling and instructions are being set up. If you have any questions please ask - several people are available to answer your questions.

Some highlights of Mt. Si Lutheran Church's Rich History (cont'd)

- · May 15, 2016--Pr. Larry Thomas accepts call as Interim Pastor to advise and lead the congregation through the transition and call processes. Organizing a transition team; doing the ministry site profile; recruiting a call committee and calling a new pastor are transition priorities.
- Congregation votes in favor for the council to move forward with hosting the winter shelter after Jan. 6, 2017 if an agreement can be reached with Congregations For the Homeless (CFH). The Shelter liaison committee reached an agreeable Memorandum of Understanding with the Congregations For the Homeless and the church will host the shelter for 45 days starting Jan. 19 through Mar. 4, 2017.
- July 31, 2016--Congregational meeting held to vote on the future of the parsonage. The majority vote was to sell the parsonage to Life Enrichment Options (LEO). The Building and Grounds committee met with LEO and decided to move forward with the offer. In Dec., the letter of intent for the sale of the parsonage was signed and LEO is taking steps to receive an approved septic design and permit.
- · April 2017--Life Enrichment Options (LEO) made decision not to move forward with the purchase of the parsonage. A committee was created to discuss options for the future of the parsonage.
- · Pr. Larry was fundamental in advising and encouraging the congregation to prepare the parsonage for a new Pastor which required extensive work and some renovations in the parsonage.
- $\cdot\,\,$  July 2017 Guatemala Mission Trip. 10 people from Mt. Si Lutheran traveled to Guatemala for service project with Habitat for Humanity.
- · Oct. 31, 2017 Reformation 500<sup>th</sup> Anniversary: the ELCA celebrates the 500<sup>th</sup> Anniversary of the day Martin Luther posted his 96 theses which touched off the Lutheran Reformation.
- · Aug. 2017 The Call Committee selected a candidate of choice that they felt would be the best match for our congregation's needs based on the survey and input from the congregation.

#### *Continued from last page*

- ... An informal meeting with council, call committee, and staff was held with Pr. Krista (Oppie) Johnson, candidate of choice, the end of August. Following this positive meeting, the Call Committee extended an invitation to Pr. Krista for a congregational meet and greet on Oct. 1st. Pr. Krista joined us for worship and after worship we had a chance to get to know Pr. Krista and enjoyed her devotion and message with the children.
- · Oct. 15<sup>th</sup> the congregation voted unanimously to offer a Letter of Call to Pr. Krista and she accepted the call. We were excited to have Pr. Krista return to the Pacific Northwest and to Mount Si Lutheran on Dec. 1, 2017.
- Nov. 12, 2017 Pr. Larry Thomas completes call process as Interim Pastor and farewell blessing and reception followed.
- · Nov. 2017 Pr. Krista moved from Elmira, NY to North Bend, WA. Pr. Krista receives a warm Mt. Si welcome and congregation helps her get moved into the parsonage.

Dec. 3, 2017 Pr. Krista began preaching on Advent Sunday.

· Dec. 16, 2017 Service of Installation by Bishop Kirby Unti and the Rev. Shelley Bryan Wee, Asst. to Bishop, NWNA Synod presided. Rev. Norma Malfatti, Director for Evangelical Mission, Upstate NY Synod gave the sermon. A welcome reception followed.


### **Annual Meeting: November 24, 2024**

# A note from Pr. Kristin-Luana serving Our Savior Lutheran in Issaquah:

Today, I am writing to you to let you know about a special event series we are planning at Our Savior's in partnership with the local Non-Profit Issaquah Arts. This cooperation came unexpectedly, and we are so grateful for it! We are planning for a Labyrinth of Lanterns as Community Art Installation. The Laby-

rinth will be up from September 21 to October 6 on the meadow behind the church. Lantern making workshops will be offered and every group can also host their own. Pr. Krista is looking into hosting a Lantern making day at Mt Si for those interested.

What is a labyrinth?



Walking the labyrinth is a meditative technique which helps us to quiet our minds. Oftentimes people focus on a spiritual question or a specific prayer. While walking towards the center of the labyrinth, we can practice focusing on the specific question or prayer. By walking out of the labyrinth, we can practice applying that specific question or prayer to our lives. This is a spiritual practice that many find helpful. Others may not. That's ok!

### FROM THE BISHOP + SEPTEMBER 2024

You might have noticed that we are in the middle of another election season. The rhetoric, the tone, the attempts to vilify and amplify are all around us – coming from candidates and superPACs and social media and neighbors and family and more.

You might wonder where does faith fit into all of this?

As Lutherans, we believe that God loves and values every single person. This means all are beloved of God – even those who we might not agree with or even like. All are God's children. This means that even those who



are the farthest from our political views are humans and worthy of care. Further, as Martin Luther once said, we are called to be little Christs for one another. This means listening and wanting the best for one another.

In saying this, please know that loving one another is not the same as remaining quiet in the presence of hate speech or abusive actions. There are times to speak up and engage. As we know from the prophets and from Jesus, we are called to work and to speak out against powers and systems that have historically marginalized or silenced so many of God's beloved people.

So I ask again, where does faith fit into all of this?

Well ... If you are full of anxiety for this coming year, if you wonder how to engage with others on issues that you care about, if you want to help foster a sense of community and love, we invite you and your congregation to join Northwest Washington Synod's LiVE Project. This coming year LiVE is engaging faith and life with new classes, retreats, and cohorts. This year's theme is *Faith Out Loud*. The 2024-25 offerings are chosen explicitly to address how to engage faith and life. This fall there is a multi-week class on Faith in Public Life starting on September 18. On October 19 there is a one-day retreat on Christian Nationalism. And from October 21-November 9 there will be an election prayer vigil. Further out in the year there is a retreat on land use, embracing difference, and a Lenten Journey along with other cohorts and more.

Together with what is happening in each of the individual congregations throughout the synod, LiVE is providing ways for people to share their faith stories, listen to one another, and connect with God and with one another to live their *faith out loud*. LiVE is a place where people from all over the synod and beyond engage in ways that foster growth, encourage conversation, provide mutual support, create community beyond difference, and ultimately connect one's faith in day-to-day life. With the different offerings, all are encouraged to participate in what God is calling us to be and to do – to cultivate empathy, love, justice, and service. To live *faith out loud*.

This coming year is full of possibilities to together live our *faith out loud*. If you have been part of LiVE in the past, we urge you to invite others. If you are interested, please talk with others in your congregation and form a group together. As you know, we are not called to an individual "me and Jesus" faith isolated from the world. Instead, faith is a communal journey where we celebrate our uniqueness as we walk in the unity of Christ. We learn, grow, support, challenge, and travel together in Christ as we live as God's beloved.

I am so grateful for the vision and leadership of synod staff members Rev. Dr. David Hahn and Ms. Mandy Neill, the LiVE Project Board, the professors and teachers, and all who have collaborated on the LiVE Project. Their work and the LiVE Project are truly gifts to this synod and to this church. Let us embrace God's love and let us live our *faith out loud*.
