# Cambridge as Metaphor for the Church

The River Cam flows north into the North Sea. On one particular bend in the river some merchants built a bridge and called it the Cam bridge, and you can see where this is going, Cambridge was established. This area has signs of inhabitation since the 1st century BC. One of the reason's my doctoral program took me to Cambridge this summer is the



incredible history in the area. I did not fully appreciate this deep and profound history until I actually walked these streets. There are streets and buildings that have been in regular continual use since the fifteen hundreds. As you walk around you are steeped in a sense of history and tradition. Walking along the street outside of King's College you can see the apple tree young Isaac Newton planted outside his dorm. (His dorm room is still used as a normal room for college students.) Reformers, scientists, poets, and philosophers have all left their mark on the world from Cambridge. As the life of a regular city moves on all around there is still a sense of awe at the history living in this place.

In Cambridge there is an awareness of the history of the place but also an eye towards the future. It is not a place stuck in the past but very present and moving forward as well. There are all the modern conveniences of any major metropolitan city center. Even as I type the newsletter article I am aware of the great reformers who founded this seminary building in the fifteen hundreds, yet I'm connected to their wireless Internet server and will email this article to Sheila.

This is a great metaphor for the church. Rather than placing the great moments of our past in glass boxes behind velvet ropes, can we be like Cambridge—connected but not frozen in that past? All too often we remember what it was like to be connected to Jesus in the good ol' days and forget to be connected to the living Christ in our midst.

I love being Lutheran for this reason. We are the church of the reformation but we continue to be the church re:forming. We are always on the move, like the city of Cambridge, looking forward but never forgetting the foundation upon which we stand.

In this season of Pentecost let the power of the Holy Spirit inspire your imaginations. Look for the presence of the Living Christ in our midst and in our world. Join in what God is doing in our neighborhood. Remain connected to the strength of our history but always drawn into what the Spirit has in store. Remember that the room Newton invented calculus in now has access to high

speed Internet. This is not a one or the other but a continuum in which we live and are called into the future.

# Welcome to the Book of Faith page. The purpose of this page is to share all things related to the Book of Faith focus at Mount Si Lutheran. Stay tuned each month, and prepare to share your input as we together do what the above tag line says, "Open Scripture and Join the Conversation".

We are now in the church season of Pentecost. It is the season in which the Church intentionally opens itself up to the Holy Spirit to work in and through us. It is the perfect opportunity for us to take time to reflect. Are we rendering ourselves flammable to the spark of the Holy Spirit? Are we allowing ourselves to be available and fully used up for the cause of furthering Christ's Kingdom here on earth? Maybe the following reading will give us something to chew on during these summer months.

#### THE ROOT AND THE FRUIT

"A tree is known by its fruit" (Matt. 12:33)

In a letter to George Whitefield, a leader of the Great Awakening, Benjamin Franklin wrote: "I can only show my gratitude for those mercies from God, by a readiness to help his other children and my brethren. For I do not think that thanks and compliments, though repeated weekly, can discharge our real obligations to each other, and much less those to our Creator. You will see in this my notion of good works, that I am far from expecting to merit heaven by them. By heaven we understand a state of happiness, infinite in degree, and eternal in duration. I can do nothing to deserve such rewards...The faith you mention has certainly its use in the world. I do not desire to see it diminished, nor would I endeavor to lessen it in any man. But I wish it were more productive of good works than I have generally seen it; I mean real good works; works of kindness, charity, mercy, and public spirit; not holiday-keeping, sermon-reading or hearing; performing church ceremonies, or making long prayers filled with flatteries and compliments...The worship of God is a duty; the hearing and reading of sermons may be useful; but if men rest in hearing and praying, as too many do, it is as if a tree should value itself for being watered and putting forth leaves, though it never produce fruit".

In aiming to declare that salvation is by grace and not works, never forget that saving faith always produces good works! Faith is the *root* of salvation. But deeds of generosity and kindness are the *fruit* of salvation— and "a tree is known by its fruit". (From: The Word for You Today devotional, entry for April 22, 2014.)

Which person in the above reading do you most closely resemble? The one who does all the right things to maintain their religious standing (i.e. church attendance, ceremonies, and prayers)? Or are you the one who puts their faith into action (i.e. works of kindness, charity, mercy, and public spirit)? During Pentecost, we are called to allow the Holy Spirit to turn our faith into action for the furtherance of God's Kingdom. For what type of fruit are you known?

# LWR Personal Health Care Kits

Beginning August 2, we will be collecting items to assemble & make personal care kits for Lutheran World Relief. - One adult-size toothbrush in its original packaging

- One metal nail clippers (attached file optional), remove packaging



This is just one of the ways we take our ministry to the community. In July we will be holding our annual Vacation Bible School, which is FREE to children in the community, pre-K-6th grade. On Sept. 7th we will be participating in the ELCA's "God's Work Our Hands" event. This will involve participating in several community service projects as we kick off our fall activities for Mt. Si. There will be kid-friendly activities that day, and we hope to have everyone participate. In addition to our single worship service at 9AM each Sunday, and our Wednesday night services, we will be holding two congregational fellowship events this summer. The Council has decided that we will be holding a focused giving campaign this summer. After careful consideration we have decided to have a focused giving campaign to raise money for a commercial-grade dishwasher for the kitchen in fellowship hall. This will allow us to use the dishes and flatware we have on hand for our coffee hours, any social events, or dinners. More information is provided below.

We continue to encourage you to consider how you might serve the congregation in pursuing our mission in the valley. We are still looking for people to serve as ushers, counters and worship assistants. You can also volunteer to help with the V.B.S. or you can serve on one of the ministry committees. # **DISHWASHER FUNDRAISER**

Mt. Si Lutheran Church Council has approved a fundraiser to purchase and install a commercial-grade dishwasher in the Fellowship Hall kitchen. The goal is to raise \$5500 for purchase and installation of dishwasher. The motivation for this purchase is as follows:

- Efficiency: Commercial dishwashers complete washing, sanitizing, and drying cycles in very short time. Targeted dishwasher will do 24 full cycles each hour.
- **Hygiene:** Commercial dishwashers utilize internal water heater to wash and sanitize dishes at temperatures that will ensure everything is both clean and germ-free.
- Cost-savings: Commercial dishwasher will eliminate present significant costs for paper and plastic products.
  Environmental: Mt. Si will significantly reduce the re-cycling or disposing of paper and plastic dishes and utensils. We also expect a net reduction in use of electricity and water by washing everything possible in the dishwasher.

# The Gift of Seeing

I grew up like many children around the world hearing about the man in the moon. I had no idea what the phrase actually referred to until one night when I was riding in the back seat of my parent's car staring out at the moon and the stars. Suddenly the image of the man's face in moon came into focus. I should out as if I was the first to discover it. "Look, the man in the moon!"

It was no great revelation to the rest of the family but for me it was a major find. In fact I felt funny, stupid for not having seen it long before. Now when I look up at this great celestial light I see the man immediately.

How could it be that for the first years of my childhood I never saw the man? And how is it that my brothers spotted him long before I did? All I saw was the moon with its contrasting shadows. And how is it that once an image comes into focus we see it almost instantly on each sighting?

Insight, awareness, vision, seeing are all essential to being people of faith.

Being late in life to see the man in the moon has created for me a sense of humility. I know that I am slow in many other areas of my life to see that which is obvious to others.

I am slow to see so much of the injustice that takes place in life. I am even slower to see the part I play in it.

I am slow to see and understand how others see the world much differently than I do.

I am slow to realize how my actions and attitude hurt others.

I am slow to realize how abundant the gifts are that God rains down on my life.

I am slow to see how gracious God is.

How is it possible that I do not see what is so obvious?

Friends, this is why the words of the confession speak loudly in my ears with such truth. The confession helps me understand why it is that I am so slow to see. The confession causes me to put all my eggs in the basket of grace. It is my only hope.

I thank you for your patience when I shout out my latest insight as if I were the first to discover it.

And this is my prayer: that your love may abound more and more in knowledge and depth of insight, so that you may be able to discern what is best and may be pure and blameless for the day of Christ. -- Philippians 1:9-10

PS There was a full moon the night my father died. The little kid in me felt as if the man in the moon was my father smiling down on me.


