#### **Council Update**

Greetings from the council. We hope that you are all doing well and coping with the corona virus responses. The council and Pastor Krista have been discussing how to implement the best plan for offering in-person gatherings. We are leaning on the wisdom and advice of our Bishop and the ELCA Presiding Bishop to make these decisions. We are also taking into account the advice of the CDC and WA State Department of Health. We are expecting that we will move into phase two sometime in June. As we move into phase two the council has decided that we will continue to have virtual services and meetings through at least June. The buildings will remain closed to any group gatherings. We will be allowing Ambur and Alisha to work in the building with proper PPE and distancing. The office will not be open for any drop in visits. We are still discussing what we want to do once the state moves into phase three.

The garden is in full swing now with most of the plots planted and growing. If you wish to work in the garden or help with any of the landscaping maintenance we ask that you maintain social distancing if there is more than one of you at a time. Suzy Cassidy has resigned from council and her position as secretary. We thank her for her service. Terry Adams has been selected to be the Secretary.

#### **Stewardship and Finance Update**

#### Payroll Protection Program / Mt Si Lutheran obtains approval

As some of you may know, The Small Business Administration (SBA) made available funds for small businesses (including churches) to borrow money to help them survive financially the COVID-19 pandemic.

The intent of the PPP program was to keep workers on the payroll and off unemployment. Business owners should have the freedom to use the funds as they see fit on other major expenses like rent, but Congress opted for payroll. While business groups and associations are lobbying to reduce the percentage used on payroll to 50%, you can't count on that and should assume the status quo. For complete forgiveness of these loans the SBA wants at lease at 75% of the funds be used on payroll.

With the approval of council, several members worked very hard on behalf of Mt Si Lutheran to apply for this loan. Mt Si Lutheran was approved for a loan of \$31,200.00, which was based on the average monthly payroll for 2019. The Council met and approved the agreement.

The goal is to keep employees and prevent the need for them to apply for unemployment. We think borrowing the amount above meets that need and is done in good faith. There has been much discussion on this issue and it is difficult as the church is really very different than most small businesses. There were many discussions with members of the Stewardship Committee, Personnel Committee, Executive Committee and Council regarding this Payroll Protection Program. We decided it was in the best interests of our employees to apply for this loan and use it as intended to assist our employees who were being negatively impacted. The church will be using the funds as recommended by the program and will not need to repay them.

Thank you to all who have responded generously to the letter sent regarding our financial outlook. Giving has increased and expenses are down. Our expenses are down mainly because of the reduction in staff hours during the stay-at-home orders. Council has also chosen to hold off on paying all our benevolence to the Synod until we are certain of continued financial stability. If we were paying all our staff their full wages and paying benevolence we would still be behind by about \$2,000 YTD. We also have significantly less ministry expenses. With this said we can't thank you enough for your generosity. We hope this will allow us to continue forward with our approved budget expenses. Council will be monitoring our finances closely along side the Steward-ship and Finance Team. We will keep you updated.

The transition from being isolated to being in groups will be somewhat of a challenge for children as they test the waters of what the boundaries are. Drastic changes are often difficult for children in ways that may not be apparent. Often their anxiety due to uncertainty will come out in play or conversations when least expected. During our time of transition, I will continue to hold Friday afternoon meetings with kids whether through Zoom meetings or in person. My thoughts and prayers continue to be with the families of Mt. Art Installation @ Mt Si Lutheran

Good day! We are just about ready to begin a beautiful, colorful and collective art installation at Mt Si. Each individual or family that wishes to create a tile will be able to pick a design: cross, tree, home or geometric/quilt pattern and pick colors: light green, dark green, light blue, dark blue, yellow, red, white, orange and pink The tiles will be square, rectangle or triangle. The photo above are some examples of what you can create. We are able to make 100+ individual designs.

If anyone wants to learn how to cut glass please contact me! We are beginning to cut the glass now. Lesia is willing to teach you in ones and twos at her home. You can then take the material home to complete the cutting. Lesia shared that this step takes a steady hand for the best result. Once all the tiles are cut, I'll invite folks to drop-in at church where you can pick the tiles and pattern. I'll have everything set-up in the breezeway.

Once you have your tiles and picked a design you will place the design on sticky contact paper. Completed designs will be returned to church so Lesia can finish the installation. These will be affixed to the risers going up to the main sanctuary doors.

This art installation will be a celebratory work of art to honor our 70th anniversary. I pray it will convey the beauty of each individual member and, together, the beauty of the community God has created here at Mt Si. Please watch the weekly news for more details!
